OWN THE PURSUIT

DAY 6: Friday, January 21st — New Heart

In Pursuit of a Pure Heart

Jesus spoke these words during His famous sermon on the mountainside in Galilee. As he ministered to a large multiethnic crowd on that day.

What does He mean by "pure in heart?"

"Pure" means to be clean, blameless, unstained by guilt, no mixed motives, wholehearted devotion to God.

Heart speaks of the mind, will and emotions.

To "see God" is to experience His presence in one's life and know him intimately in the life to come.

The Beatitudes are congratulatory exclamations. They teach that blessedness come from cultivating attributes that are approved by God. Eric Liddell says that the Sermon on the Mount is a working philosophy of life for the Christian. He quotes G. K. Chesterton as saying, "The first time you read it you feel it is impossible. After the second reading it feels like nothing else is possible".¹

Take the time to read the verse a few times with honesty and after multiple readings ask yourself, "is there is any other way to live?"

- What qualifies to be pure in heart?
- Can God congratulate you for being pure in heart?
